

John Kenneth Wyatt, MD

1930-2004



John Kenneth Wyatt was born in Detroit, Michigan and grew up in London, Ontario, where he attended the University of Western Ontario, graduating in Medicine in 1954. While an undergraduate at Western, Jack excelled in sports and was captain of the Western Mustang Football Team.

Jack completed his General and Urology training in London and joined the small Urology faculty there in 1960. He published one of the first papers on the beneficial effects of chemotherapy for testis cancer. Dr. Wyatt steadily built the UWO Urology Residency Programme, serving as the Programme Director and Division Chair for 15 years. Jack was best known for his clinical acumen, his caring attitude towards his patients as well as his residents. An excellent clinical teacher, Jack was well-known for his common touch and his sense of humor, whether he was lecturing to medical students, doing bedside or operating room teaching or chatting with the janitor. Dr. Wyatt was an active contributor to the Royal College and the Canadian Urological Association, serving as CUA President in 1984.

Aside from Urology, Jack had a life-long passion for skiing and golf and was known for some of his antics at the CUA golf tournaments. Dr. Wyatt is survived by his very supportive wife Mary and three wonderful children. Jack will be remembered by his former residents and colleagues as a role model and builder of Canadian Urology.
